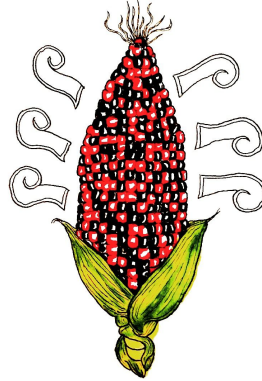


Xicana Indígena Bibliography
